Each part of the uniform reflects something of the three-fold aspects of the Godhead as well as something of the blessings that flow to us as children of God.

TRUTH:

The belt was the piece of uniform that held the breastplate in place. Unlike Satan, who is a complete liar, everything about <u>Father God</u> is true and truthful (Psalm 31:5). <u>Jesus declared "I am... the truth"</u> (John 14:6). The <u>Holy Spirit</u> only speaks truth to us (John 16:13). <u>God's Word</u> is truth (John 17:17). Because we are children of God in Messiah, being truthful or not allowing Satan to have any deceptive hold in us is part of our defensive armour (Leviticus 19:11): we cannot be truly righteous unless we are being wholly truthful. Learning to use or speak out the truth of God's Word to expose the enemy's lies is also part of our defensive armour (Ephesians 6:14). Amazing! Father God has every angle covered.
